A fundamental respect for the dignity of every human soul, valuing our differences, should be cultivated in every heart. Then we can expand our understanding to homes, classrooms, schools, states, our nation and beyond. Through study of history, political science, philosophy, and other humanities disciplines, we will explore the questions of: what are human rights, how can a human rights lens help us make sense of historical and contemporary challenges, and how can we teach about, through, and for human rights?

We will ground our study on the values of dignity, curiosity, joy, equity, hope, perseverance, and justice. Scholars will examine the rights and responsibilities that define the relationship of people to the government and to each other, racial justice, economic inequality, migration, global conflict, and student dignity.
